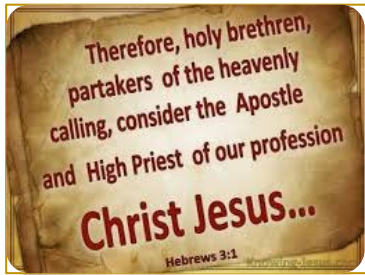

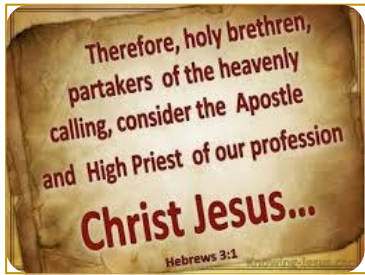

Introduction

Moses has always been highly revered by Jewish people, by the Christian church, and even in Hollywood movies. But Jesus should receive much more honor and glory than Moses. “The Lawgiver,” Moses, served God faithfully. But Christ was much more than a servant—he was God’s Son.
