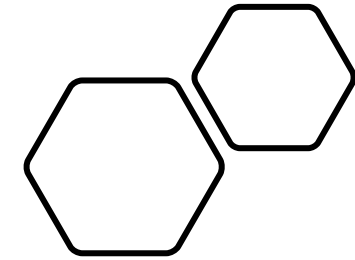

Introduction

The flow of thought from chapter 5 to chapter 6 of Galatians reminds us that the original letter that Paul wrote had no breaks. In the last verses assigned to chapter 5, Paul had already begun to urge the Galatians to express the “fruit of the Spirit” in their relationships.



Introduction

In Galatians 5:25-26, Paul offered practical counsel for living “by the Spirit: keeping in step with the Spirit on the one hand while avoiding pride and envy on the other. In this section, Paul spelled out in practical terms what a “life in the Spirit” should look like.
